On the 30th of January, 2011, as a part of the response to the national call given against the travesty of justice in the Dr. Binayak Sen case, demanding the release of Dr. Binayak Sen now and immediate scrapping of the law on sedition, it was decided that a programme should take place at Gandhi Circle in the morning.

The Programme would begin with a two minute silence at 11 am paying our respects to Mahatma Gandhi's martyrdom followed by a Sarva Dharma Prathana till 11.30am. This would be followed by a two hour discussion on the above subject. **Prem Krishnaji would chair it. Sawaiji would be the Moderator.**

It may be recalled that the **30th January being Martyrs Day, also symbolizes how Gandhi also opposed this section.** He was convicted several times for Sedition and he wrote a lot against this section in the Indian IPC.

We hope that you will join in large numbers and come to the meeting demanding justice for Dr. Binayak Sen, scrapping the sedition law and strengthening democratic rights.
